


Local Declaration Process



A declaration/resolution is required for inclusion in a Presidential Declaration. When in doubt declare for an emergency/disaster. (Local to County)


County Government




County Government Role

The Declaration Process in a County Declared Disaster



County provides support to local government

County requests assistance from the State *when* needs exceed all available local and county resources

Tribal Declaration


☐ Tribal nations located within Nevada, are recognized as sovereign nations.

Tribal nations can apply through the county, state, or directly to

FEMA.



Tribal Declaration


County/state/federal involvement for resolution of the situation requires that the tribal nation request assistance using the same procedures as any other incorporated community within a county

State Government



- Assists county government
- Provides state resources
 - From state cache
 - From contractors
 - National Guard
 - NEMAC
- Requests Presidential Declaration (when necessary)
- Coordinates with FEMA


Local government continues to coordinate and direct efforts

Federal Government

- FEMA (Federal Emergency Management Agency) acts on behalf of the President to provide:
 - □ Grants
 - Other resources from Departments
 - ☐ Federal Agencies support
 - ☐ Military support (Army, Marines, Navy, Air Force)
 - ☐ WMD response teams
 - ☐ Etc.

State requests support from FEMA as necessary



Declaration Pros and Cons

- ☐ FEMA and affiliated agencies will monitor the event through an on-site liaison or through DEM's point of contact
- Other federal agencies may provide assistance without a Presidential declaration
- Without a Presidential declaration, FEMA funding is not available
- Even with a Presidential declaration, not all programs requested in the declaration may be approved
- Local government or tribal nation is responsible for all costs of the event
