

NTAC Area of Operation & TLO/FLO Program Outreach:

- The NTAC is responsible for 16* of the 17 counties, all State agencies and Tribal lands in Nevada.
- Clark county has separate but related FLO program.
- NTAC and Las Vegas (SNCTC) have similar FLO Basic training template. We are working to standardize core curriculums.
- * The Northern Nevada Regional Intelligence Center (NNRIC) based in Reno is a valuable partner in our information sharing environment.






NTAC: all-crimes, all-hazards mission

Tribal Outreach



- Indian reservations have unique and varying crime related issues and outreach is important
- NTAC FLO/TLO outreach begins at the statewide inter-tribal councils and by inviting tribal employees to all training
- NTAC FLO/TLO Coordinator uses the Nevada Division of Emergency Management tribal coordinator for specific training/outreach requests

Tribal Outreach Benefits



- The FLO program conducts Active Shooter and FLO training which has been widely accepted on tribal lands
- Sharing of information to/from NTAC center to tribal/BIA law enforcement
- Physical Plant Threat Assessments for tribal infrastructure is offered to tribal management officials
- SafeVoice resources



Core FLO/TLO Free Training Offered to tribes



- FLO/TLO Basic Classes (4-hrs.-POST certified)
- Active Shooter Classes (4 or 8 hr.)
- Behavioral Threat Assessment Management (3 hrs.-3 days)
- Intermediate FLO/TLO Classes (Includes 8 hr. Domestic Terrorism, 8 hr. Transnational Terrorism Class-all POST certified- and other classes sponsored by FLO Program, including IT/DT 4 hr. Academy Trainings).
- Sovereigns/Anti-government/1st Amendment Audits (2 and or 4-hour POST classes).
- FBI WMD, Crime Scene Class (8 hr.)
- Gangs/OMG (8 hour-RMIN/NDOC)
- Rad-Eye Detector Class (Health)
- LEOKA (8 hours)
