Please call the NDEM Duty Officer at **775-687-0498** and notify them prior to contacting AFRCC, <u>unless it is an</u> <u>immediate Life Safety issue</u>. If it is a Life Safety Issues, please call the DEM Duty Officer second. This way the state can support your request to the AFRCC or your request will be denied by them.

AFRCC will ask the following questions. Be prepared to have the following information.

- \checkmark Is the subject wanted by the police for a criminal matter?
- ✓ Is the subject a danger to themselves or to other persons?
- ✓ Does the subject not wish to be found?

NOTE: If the answer to any of these three questions is "**YES**", the AFRCC may not assist in the search.* *-(As long as it is not a criminal event and there is no weapon involved, AFRCC May choose to help with certain capabilities they use. This is a case-by-case basis decided upon by the Watch Commander)
