Tribal Nations Training Week 2025 Training Tracks Available

<u>Continuity of Operations</u> Training Track provides training on continuity of operations and a workshop to begin planning "COOP" plans. There will also be an all-hazards and special needs population considerations during emergency response sections to provide mitigation process planning at a whole-community level.

<u>Cyber training</u> track provides training on understanding of cyber-attacks, how they occur, criminal processes as well as risk awareness for officials and senior management. These are non-technical and include training on preparing for cyber-attacks, incidents and creating physical and cybersecurity for critical infrastructure. Communicating effectively and psychological preparedness for responders are additions to this week-long training track.

<u>Executive</u> training track provides opportunities for leadership officials to network, and train for transportation emergency preparedness and security, emergency management for Tribal leaders, participate in a workshop for all-hazards preparedness, drone assessment with response tactics and lectures on the opioid epidemic and active shooter response. There will be a closed listening session with FEMA leadership as well as tours to learn what resources the Center for Domestic Preparedness has to offer.

<u>Exercise</u> training track begins with Hazmat Awareness, this outlines the potential materials that are near or being transported through Tribal Nations. Then the Homeland Security Exercise & Evaluation training on principles, as well as a common approach to exercise program management, design and development, conduct, evaluation, and improvement planning. The workshop section will aid to develop, execute, and evaluate exercises that address preparedness priorities informed by risk and capability assessments, findings, corrective actions from previous events, and external requirements. Then assess and document strengths, areas for improvement, capability performance, and corrective actions in an After-Action Report/Improvement Plan

<u>Funding and Grants</u> training track provides training on the fundamentals of grant management, identifying Tribal Nation preparedness resources, and strengthening community resilience. There will also be a detailed discussion section on point of dispensation operations.

<u>Managing Public Information</u> (Healthcare track A) provides students with the practical knowledge of the role of the Public Information Officer, or other designee, emergency communications methods, risk communication, and interpersonal skills. Message development, delivery, legal

considerations, press conferences, the joint Information Center, and strategic communication. Various public information activities and exercises, such as writing messages and conducting press conferences. A practical exercise designed to plan, develop, integrate, and disseminate public information for an emergency, incident, or disaster.

<u>Healthcare Leadership</u> (Healthcare Track B) addresses disaster preparedness at the facility and system level. Preparing for incidents that may result in multiple casualties, from a natural disaster, a release of a chemical, biological, radiological, nuclear, or explosive (CBRNE) hazard, or a disease outbreak. This course focuses on preparing for critical decisions in all-hazards disaster emergency preparedness activities. Responders learn essential disaster-planning response and recovery functions that are then applied in a tabletop exercise and a two-day functional exercise.

<u>Healthcare Emergency Response Team</u> (HERT) training track begins with a session on planning and challenges for underserved populations during a crisis event. HERT focuses on response at the operations level and prepares healthcare responders to integrate the Hospital Incident Command System into the community emergency response network during mass casualty incidents. Determining and using PPE, conducting triage, and decontamination of ambulatory and nonambulatory patients. The *Integrated Capstone Event* will be built into the course and promotes an interdisciplinary response.

<u>Tribal Curriculum</u> Track includes Emergency Management Framework for Tribal Governments which involves emergency management principles, leading and directing their tribes in developing and implementing comprehensive emergency management systems. Identification and analysis of hazards, developing emergency operations plans, readiness through training and exercises, forming partnerships, upgrading and sustaining emergency management capabilities. This track also includes a section on Natural Disaster Awareness for Community Leaders that trains on natural disasters, risk assessment, procedures, operations, vulnerability factors, and plans and tools needed in planning and identifying individuals and groups best equipped to address response and recovery requirements in the case of an actual disaster. The session closes out with Psychological Preparedness for Responders to aid in addressing the stressors involved with critical events.
