- <u>APPROVAL OF MINUTES</u> (Discussion/For Possible Action) Chair Amell. This agenda item will discuss whether or not to approve the minutes of the September 12, 2012 NCSC meeting.
- 4. <u>COMMENTS BY THE CHAIRMAN</u> (Discussion Only) Chair Amell. The Chairman will discuss trends at the state, national or global level that may affect the NCSC. Some of these items may be procedural, administrative or policy trends.
