INCIDENT NAME – LOCATION: Atmospheric River #03082023-387 (Region 1 – Southern Nevada – Esmeralda County and Yomba Tribe (Nye County)), (Region 2 – Western Nevada – Carson, Churchill, Douglas, Humboldt, Lyon, Mineral, Storey, Washoe) and (Region 3 – Eastern Nevada – Elko and White Pine County)

TIME OF INCIDENT: 12:00 AM PST on 08MAR23

INCIDENT DESCRIPTION:

The first wave of Atmospheric River is still here and present in northern and western Nevada. It continues to snow at higher elevations, and on and off snowing in the valleys. This first wave of storms generated rain at lower elevations, melting snowpacks and causing flooding across low lying and flood plain areas, as well as lower creeks and streams. Water flow is expected to dissipate over 11MAR23 and 12MAR23 and is anticipated to pick back up again with the second wave of Atmospheric River potentially moving into the area on the afternoon of 13MAR23. The second wave of atmospheric river is anticipated to be colder than this previous storm and bring with it more snow and rain into already impacted and flooded areas, as well as generating more thaw and possible flooding.

CONDITIONS

CURRENT SITATION (as of 11:00 AM on 11MAR23)

Rain and snow precipitation is currently impacting much of western Nevada, although precipitation rates today should be much lower than the we have seen with this storm. Sunday will provide respite from the weather and precipitation and allow responders and jurisdictions time to breath and prepare for the next wave. The next wave is anticipated to move into western Nevada on 13MAR23 in the afternoon to evening hours, however Tuesday is forecasted to be the day where most impacts will be seen.
