CONDITIONS

CURRENT SITUATION (as of 1200 PM on 06JUN23): Per the NWS Reno, isolated to scattered thunderstorms with localized rainfall, gusty winds, small hail, and lightning are expected this week. Snowmelt continues to contribute to fast, cold flowing river and creek levels. The East Fork/Mainstem Walker River will maintain moderate flooding stages while minor flood impacts to agriculture and open areas persist along the Carson River System. Higher flows will travel towards Winnemucca on the Humboldt River. Snowmelt will be reduced as temperatures return closer to normal, however heavy rainfall may bring increased flash flood risk. Walker River near Wabuska remains at moderate flood stage rising to over 12.5 feet by the weekend. Walker River near Mason will reach 11.5 feet just under major flood stage. The Humboldt River at Comus is at moderate flood stage at 10.9 feet. The Walker River near Schurz is the only gauge at major flood level expected to rise to 7.22 feet through the week.


