
## CONDITIONS

**CURRENT SITUATION** (as of 1200 PM on 015JUN23): Per the NWS Reno, the wet weather pattern has subsided and dry, warmer weather is projected through the weekend although it will be short lived as a windy cold front is anticipated for Sunday and into Monday and below average temperatures next week. Portions of the Walker River continue to see minor to moderate flooding conditions. Minor flooding continues along the Humboldt River near Imlay, at Comus and at Battle Mountain. The Walker River near Wabuska continues to be at moderate flood stage at 12.3 feet, about one foot under major flood stage. The Walker River near Mason – Snyder Lane is at 11.3, just under major flooding stage. The Walker River near Schurz is at moderate flood stage at 18.98 feet, just under major flooding stage.
