**LOCATION:** Nevada (Region 2)

TIME OF INCIDENT: 12:00 AM on 8MAR23

**INCIDENT DESCRIPTION:** The Nevada Operations Center (NVOC) is partially activated per the Division of Emergency Management (DEM) Spring Thaw Plan. The purpose of this

activation is to increase our efforts for monitoring,

preparedness, and supporting any jurisdictions in responding

to flooding impacts.

### **CONDITIONS**

**CURRENT SITUATION** (as of 12:00 PM on 26JUN23): Per the National Weather Service Reno, expect increasing storm coverage of slow-moving storms through Wednesday with a 20 - 30% chance for a storm to impact any specific location. Primary threats will be lightning, small hail, and localized heavy rainfall. Warmer and drier conditions arrive Thursday with temperatures forecast in the mid to upper 90s. Heat will reinvigorate snowmelt across the Sierra during the latter half of the week bringing renewed flows in Eastern Sierra streams from I-80 south and increased flooding along the Walker. The Walker River near Wabuska is the only gauge in moderate flood stage at 11.6 feet and is receding.

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
