

### **NEVADA OPERATIONS CENTER (NVOC) SITREP**

**INCIDENT NAME – LOCATION:** 2023 Atmospheric River - 2 #03092023-387 (Region 1 – Southern Nevada – Esmeralda County, Lincoln County, Nye County), (Region 2 – Western Nevada – Carson, Churchill, Douglas, Humboldt, Lyon, Mineral, Storey, Washoe) and (Region 3 – Eastern Nevada – Elko, Eureka, Lander, and White Pine County)

TIME OF INCIDENT: 12:00 AM PST on 08MAR23

**INCIDENT DESCRIPTION:** An Atmospheric River will impact Nevada bringing storms over the next couple of weeks with peak rain, snow, and winds throughout the state over several days. **Residual flooding from the storms causing flooding impacting the above counties and tribal nations.**

## CONDITIONS

#### CURRENT SITUATION (as of 12:00 PM on 20MAR23)

Per the National Weather Service (NWS) Reno, the next round of precipitation moves in overnight. High flows will continue downstream to Lahontan Reservoir due to releases, but there is low risk for new flooding due to colder storms. Snow will spread from Mono County northward Tuesday morning, with showers reaching Tahoe Basin and western Nevada late morning. Rounds of light showers are possible through the week. Per the National Weather Service (NWS) Las Vegas, runoff within Meadow Valley Wash will remain elevated, primary contributor being releases from Eagle Valley Reservoir. Minor to moderate flooding is forecast to continue through the week Widespread precipitation is expected Tuesday and Wednesday with snowfall above 5,500 feet. The Flood Warning has been extended through Friday.
