Nevada – Elko, Eureka, Lander, and White Pine County)

TIME OF INCIDENT: 12:00 AM PST on 08MAR23

**INCIDENT DESCRIPTION:** An Atmospheric River will impact Nevada bringing storms over the next couple of weeks with peak rain, snow, and winds throughout the state over several days. **Residual flooding from the storms causing flooding impacting the above counties and tribal nations.**

#### **CONDITIONS**

#### **CURRENT SITUATION** (as of 12:00 PM on 22MAR23)

Per the National Weather Service (NWS) Reno, scattered showers will initiate this afternoon. Sporadic accumulations up to 2-4 inches of snow are expected in the Sierra and up to half an inch in western Nevada. Per NWS Las Vegas, scattered to numerous showers and isolated thunderstorms are expected this evening and overnight. Runoff within Meadow Valley Wash will remain elevated, primary contributor being releases from Eagle Valley Reservoir. Minor to moderate flooding is forecast to continue through the week. The Flood Warning has been extended through Friday. Per the NWS Elko, a Winter Storm Warnings continue through Wednesday. An Areal Flood Watch continues for southern Lander, Eureka, White Pine and northern portions of Nye County through Wednesday.
