

### **NEVADA OPERATIONS CENTER (NVOC) SITREP**

**INCIDENT NAME – LOCATION:** 2023 Atmospheric River - 2 #03092023-387 (Region 1 – Southern Nevada – Esmeralda County, Lincoln County, Nye County), (Region 2 – Western Nevada – Carson, Churchill, Douglas, Humboldt, Lyon, Mineral, Storey, Washoe) and (Region 3 – Eastern Nevada – Elko, Eureka, Lander, and White Pine County)

TIME OF INCIDENT: 12:00 AM PST on 08MAR23

**INCIDENT DESCRIPTION:** An Atmospheric River will impact Nevada bringing storms over the next couple of weeks with peak rain, snow, and winds throughout the state over several days. **Residual flooding from the storms causing flooding impacting the above counties and tribal nations.**

### CONDITIONS

#### CURRENT SITUATION (as of 12:00 PM on 24MAR23)

Per the National Weather Service (NWS) Reno, increased snow shower activity in the Sierra with scattered showers throughout the day. Greatest concern in W. NV will be rapid changes in visibility; however, snow accumulation will be minimal. Well below normal temperatures continue through the weekend with anticipation of another colder storm impact Monday night into Wednesday next week. Per NWS Las Vegas, scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms today. Runoff within Meadow Valley Wash will remain elevated, primary contributor being releases from Eagle Valley Reservoir. Minor to moderate flooding is forecasted to continue. Flood Warning in effect until Friday afternoon. Per the NWS Elko, another round of showers today and into Friday will bring minor snow accumulations to valley areas. A Winter Weather Advisory has been issued for the Ruby Mountains and East Humboldt Range. Flood warning continues for S. Eureka County.
